Chaired by Mr. Stéphane Le Foll, Vice-President of the Initiative. Inspiring speech by Dr Deborah Bossio from The Nature Conservancy.
 - Opportunity to: review the activities of the Initiative and its Scientific and Technical Committee (STC), take stock of the CIRCASA project, and present the winners of the 2018 World Future Council "Agro-ecology" Future Policy Award.
 - Followed by 4 parallel thematic workshops.

KEY MESSAGES

- Soil carbon seguestration is a carbon dioxide removal option with bene for biodiversity, soil health, soil fertility and food security.
- restoration and soil carbon sequestration.
- contribution of soil carbon sequestration to climate change mitigation.
- Soil carbon sequestration should be an additional effort for climate change mitigation and never as a substitute for urgently required, highly ambitious and immediate actions for reducing greenhouse gas emissions elsewhere.
- The signatories of this submission encourage the Koronivia negotiators to treat the maintenance and increase of soil carbon, health and fertility as ar exemplary indicator of holistically improved agricultural systems in changing climate with concomitant mitigation and adaptation benefits.
- In comparison with the biophysical potentials for soil carbon sequestration there is a large gap in NDC commitments.
- The signatories of this submission offer their scientific expertise or carbon and soil-derived ecosystem services to the UNFCCC
- A proposal for the agenda of the KJWA workshop, topic 2(c) is provided
- The signatories of this submission welcome and highly value the inclusion of improved soil carbon, soil health and soil fertility under grassland and cropland as well as integrated

Organization of regional meetings

- Agriculture is the Solution! For Climate Change (Shiga (Japan) from 13 to 15 May 2019)
 - Organized in Shiga (Japan) by the **Japanese Ministry of Agriculture**, **Forestry and Fisheries** with the support of Shiga Prefecture, the **FAO**, the **World Bank** and the **"4 per 1000 " Initiative -** 697 participants from 21 countries 3 days 39 presentations
 - Key Messages :

Multi-stakeholder exchanges are fundamental to inclusive decision-making and successful action on climate change in the field.

Farmers are at the center of the fight against climate change and play a key role in scaling up proven solutions.

All stakeholder must **recognize the valuable role of farmers** at the forefront of CC and caregivers of global food security and nutrition.



Budget & Finance

In Katowice, 2019 annual budget of k€ 1,045 adopted



- AR 18 In **2019**: **k€ 238 spent** (Estimate end 2019) on **k€** 427 available (k€ 174 from 2018 + k€ 222 from French MAA + k€ 20 from Spanish MA + k€ 10 from Danone + k€ 1 from IT2)
 - French Ministry of Agriculture (1 secondment) and Spanish Ministry of Agriculture (1 secondment) & German Ministry of Agriculture (1,5 secondments)
 - In addition total contribution in kind: k€ 43 from: Cirad (k€ 27), CGIAR System Organization, Region Occitanie and Agropolis International (k€ 10), INRA (k€ 6), Spanish MA (meeting rooms) and Agreenium



Budget & Finance (2)




- In addition, organisation of the Symposium
 "Agriculture is the Solution! for climate change" in Asia budget of €10,893
 - Financed by the **French Development Agency** for €20,000 (ES management)
- A total amount of expenses: € 238,345
- As at 31 December 2019, the available balance of the 2019 budget is estimated at approximately €198,000 out of a total budget (including the Asia Symposium) of €427,042.
